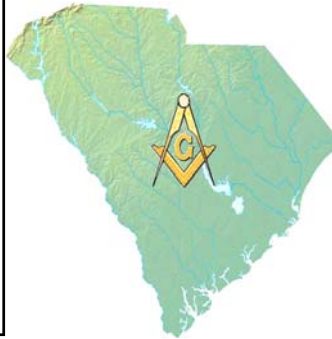
leaves that will, most definitely, fall upon your yard.

FAMOUS MASONS: BRO. "HARPO" MARX

Arthur Adolph "Harpo" Marx (November 23, 1888 – September 28, 1964), born Adolph Arthur Marx, was the second-born of the Marx Brothers and a unique comic performer whose style was influenced by clown and pantomime traditions. He was well known by his trademarks: he wore a curly reddish wig, he never talked during performances (although he often blew a horn or whistled to communicate), he frequently used props (such as a walking stick with a built-in bulb horn), and he played

the harp.

His non-speaking in his early films was occasionally referenced by the other Marx Brothers, who were careful to imply that his character's not speaking was a choice rather than a disability. They would make joking reference to this part of his act. For example, in Animal Crackers his character was ironically dubbed "The Professor". In The Cocoanuts, this exchange occurred:

Groucho: Who is this?

Chico: At's-a my partner, but he no speak.

Groucho: Oh, that's your silent partner!

In later films Harpo was put into situations where he would repeatedly attempt to convey a vital message to another person, but only did so through nonverbal means. These scenes reinforced the idea that the character was unable to speak.

Masonic Education: FREEMASONRY AND BROTHERHOOD

The fraternity of Free and Accepted Masons has members from every ethnic group and every continent in the world. Brotherhood is a primary teaching of Masonry--that each person must be judged as an individual, on his own merits, and that such factors as race, national origin, religious creed, social status, or wealth are incidental to the person's character.

Freemasonry was brought to North America in the 1700s, a time when racial attitudes were very different from today. Since a petition for membership in Masonry does not ask a peti-

tioner's race, statistics on ethnic breakdowns are not kept by any Grand Lodge.

Collecting such information is considered as inappropriate as collecting information about a Brother's financial standing.

A lodge is not permitted to accept or exclude a candidate on the basis of his race or national origin.

To petition for membership, the petitioner must be "a man of legal age, good reputation, and possess a belief in God."

While election to membership in the fraternity is a matter for

the local lodge to decide, the qualifications for membership are standard, and all Masons are required to observe them.

BE PREPARED - THE BOY SCOUT MOTTO

Are you prepared? Although I was a Boy Scout, I was not. For what, you might ask. In the event you lose your wallet and your identification, money and many things meaningful to you. Granted, they CAN be replaced, but it is a headache to piece your life back together if you are not prepared. I am offering a few suggestions to help you should you ever find yourself in this situation:

- 1) KNOW what is in your wallet. Make copies of everything in your wallet if you can, especially your credit card numbers AND the contact information to

- 2) CONTACT your financial institutions IMMEDIATELY. This is your bank, credit card companies, etc. Also, contact one of the three major credit reporting companies to place a "FREEZE" on your account so that nothing can be changed or applied for in your name for 60 days.
- 3) FILE a police report. Go to the jurisdiction you LAST remember seeing your wallet. Be ready to tell them EVERYTHING that was in your wallet (take the copies).

- 4) Remember things like your health card, your Masonic Dues Card, your membership cards to other organizations. Try to have a copy of them and contact them as soon as possible.
- 5) Contact the Department of Motor Vehicles ASAP and get a replacement driver's license. Make sure you have your vehicle registration and proof of insurance as well!

I hope and pray this never happens to you, but if it does, I hope that you ARE PREPARED. Take care and God Bless.

your way" in.

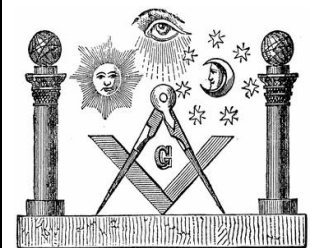
