


**Grand Master Visit**

### FAMOUS MASONS: M.W. Bro. Andrew Jackson

Andrew Jackson (March 15, 1767 – June 8, 1845) was the seventh President of the United States (1829–1837). He was military governor of Florida (1821), commander of the American forces at the Battle of New Orleans (1815), and eponym of the era of Jacksonian democracy. A polarizing figure who dominated American politics in the 1820s and 1830s, his political ambition combined with widening political partici-

pation, shaping the modern Democratic Party. His legacy is now seen as mixed, as a protector of popular democracy and individual liberty, checkered by his support for Indian removal and slavery. Renowned for his toughness, he was nicknamed "Old Hickory". As he based his career in developing Tennessee, Jackson was the first president primarily associated with the American frontier. His portrait appears on the U.S. twenty-

dollar bill. M.W. Bro. Jackson was a member of St. Tammany Lodge No. 1 (A.K.A. Harmony Lodge No. 1), Nashville, Tennessee. He served as Grand Master of Masons of Tennessee, October 7, 1822 until October 4, 1824. For more information on this Most Worshipful Brother, visit:

## Masonic Education: Right Angle & Perpendicular





Sure, every Mason knows what they are. We see them all the time. We may, however, forget some of the more "intricate" meanings of these two simple geometric icons which help us in our lessons and our conduct. As you read the following from Phoenixmasonry, think back to the first time you ever heard them mentioned. Pause and reflect upon their meaning and place in your everyday lives. Like Operative Masonry, there is little room for error in knowing what the bounds are and what to expect.

Right Angle

A right angle is the meeting of two lines in an angle of ninety degrees, or the fourth part of a circle. Each of its lines is perpendicular to the other; and as the perpendicular line is a symbol of uprightness of conduct, the right angle has been adopted by Freemasons as an emblem of virtue. Such was its signification among the Pythagoreans. The right angle is represented in the Lodges by the square, as the horizontal is by the level, and the perpendicular by the plumb.

#### Perpendicular

In a geometrical sense, that which is upright or erect, leaning neither one way or another. In a figurative and symbolic sense, it conveys the signification of Justice, Fortitude, Prudence, and Temperance. Justice, that leans to no side but that of Truth; Fortitude, that yields to no adverse attack; Prudence that ever pursues the straight path of integrity; and Temperance that swerves not for appetite nor passion.

As we celebrate our nation's birthday, we must pause to reflect on the guiding hand our Fraternity played in our nation's founding and its continuing prosperity. Of the 56 delegates that signed the original Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776, 13 were confirmed to be members of the Craft. The famous of these confirmed Masons were Benjamin Franklin and John Hancock. Eight more are suspected of being Masons including John Adams and Thomas Jefferson. Other Masonic figures in the Revolution include George Washington (of course), Henry Knox, Paul Revere, John Paul Jones, Gilbert du Motier Marquis de LaFayette, Rufus King, James Otis, Friedrich Wilhelm Ludolf Gerhard Augustin von Steuben, Pierre Charles L'Enfant Joseph Warren, and (sadly) Benedict Arnold.

What these brothers accomplished is the creation of a nation unique in human his-

tory. Never before in human history had a nation been founded upon ideals of unity and equality rather than race, ethnicity, or religion. We, as Masons, of course recognize these values as we inculcate these values throughout the various degrees. We quote Psalms 133:1 stating "how good it is for brethren to dwell together in unity." We teach that all Masons "meet on the level" the same as Jefferson writes that "all Men are created equal." Is it any wonder that an endeavor founded on such solid principles has lasted despite all of the problems and issues?

The same as our nation was founded with guidance of such famous and estimable Masons, it has been preserved by the blood and toil of Masons both famous and obscure. Generals Andrew Jackson, Winfield Scott, and Omar Bradley led men (and assuredly brothers) in battle to protect and defend liberty. We have wondered at the accomplishments of astro-

nauts (and brothers) Edwin E. "Buzz" Aldrin, Jr. and John Glenn. We have enjoyed Samuel Clemens (Mark Twain), Mel Blanc (the voice of Bugs Bunny and Daffy Duck), and John Wayne.


### CAVE DEGREE SCHEDULE INCLUDES S.C. DEGREE

### FREE, ACCEPTED, ETC...

Not bound, not in captivity, The word "Free" in connection with "Mason" originally signified that the persons so called were free of the company of Guild or incorporated Masons. During the middle ages the craftsman that were trained in the Roman Colleges of Artificers were serfs, bondsmen, and were declared free to travel throughout Europe, building cathedrals, monasteries, and other religious buildings. The Masons who were selected to build the Temple of Solomon were declared free, and were exempted, together with their descendants, from imports, duties and taxes. They had also the privilege to bear

arms. At the destruction of the temple by Nebuchadnezzer, the posterity of these Masons were carried into captivity with the ancient Jews. But the good-will of Cyrus gave them permission to erect a second temple, having set them at liberty for that purpose. It is from this epoch that we bear the name Free and Accepted Masons. Ezra 2:1

AFM State: Ancient Free Masons


